These will be carried out in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1011, 11th Edition, 1st January 2009 and the Jumping Rules, Annex VII, 23rd edition effective 1st January 2009.

All horses taking part at this event must be presented during the first horse inspected; otherwise they are not permitted to participate.

“General Regulations”, 23rd Edition, effective 1st January 2009, will apply:

Art 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country, and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art.139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET, REGS, APPENDIX VI (Except event taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between one and three months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacture's instructions, which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet, Regs, Chapter V & VI and Annex III)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI***/****, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. In CICs***/****, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Group 1 & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP 1 & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups 1&II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

“All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents to their horse. These are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance proving full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep policy up to date.”

6) EVENTS ORGANISATION- (Art. 115)

In exceptional circumstances together with the approval of Chefs d'Equine and Ground Jury the OC reserve the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

7) ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Detail concerning right of entry shows grounds of owners, grooms, riders, and other persons.

8) DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY:

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outline in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for OCs to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted in order to avoid the participant having to pay the same tax against in his own country. No taxes payable in UAE.

STABLE SECURITY /STEWARDING AT INTERNATIONAL EVENTS.**MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO ENSURE IMPLEMENTATION OF VRs Art. 1005.2.5****1) ACCESS TO STABLE AREA**

The stables must be completely enclosed within a suitable restrictive perimeter (stable area) that will act both as a deterrent to the admission of unauthorized person and to the exit of horses. The area must be sufficiently large to allow horse to be evacuated from the stables in an emergency, but still remain within the confines of the perimeter.

Whenever possible the stable area must include only stables, lorries, caravans etc. should not be permitted within the area unless specifically needed as accommodation for horses and or grooms.

Access to stable must be limited to those persons indicated in VRs Art. 1005.2.5 it is essential that the official issuing authorized access be a responsible person of seniority within the Organizing Committee.

2) CONTROL OF ACCESS

A control system must operate at all entrance gates so that there in an efficient and reliable method of identifying those who enter and leave the stable area at any time.

Extra vigilance must be used in establishing the identity of persons and reasons for entering the stables during the night.

3) STEWARDING OF STABLE AREA

At least one stable steward directly responsible to the chief Steward must be present readily available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day during the entire duration of the event. He may by assisted by deputies as required. The steward/ Deputies must regularly patrol the stable area without establishing any predetermined pattern. To discourage any form of illegal

practice or abuses to horse. Any misdemeanors must immediately be reported to the stable stewards who must, in turn report to the Chief Stewards.

The duty of the stewards is therefore to safeguard the welfare of the horses and to prevent any form of illegal practices.

4) GROOMS

It is appreciated that grooms wish to remain with their Horses during the night. Only grooms duly registered with the OC are permitted to do so.

The person responsible must ensure that his/her grooms or any other authorized persons with access to his/her horses are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures operating at the event attended.

5) MOVEMENT THROUGHOUT EVENT GROUNDS

Movement of horses between the stables, practice, grazing and main arena must be strictly controlled. The optimum layout for jumping and dressing disciplines is attached. It is appreciated that flexibility will be required depending on the requirements of other disciplines.

6) STEWARDING OF PRACTICE ARENA

The Chief Steward must ensure that each practice arena is adequately stewarded at all times that it/they are officially open. He must also ensure that all practice arenas are subject to random control when they are officially closed.

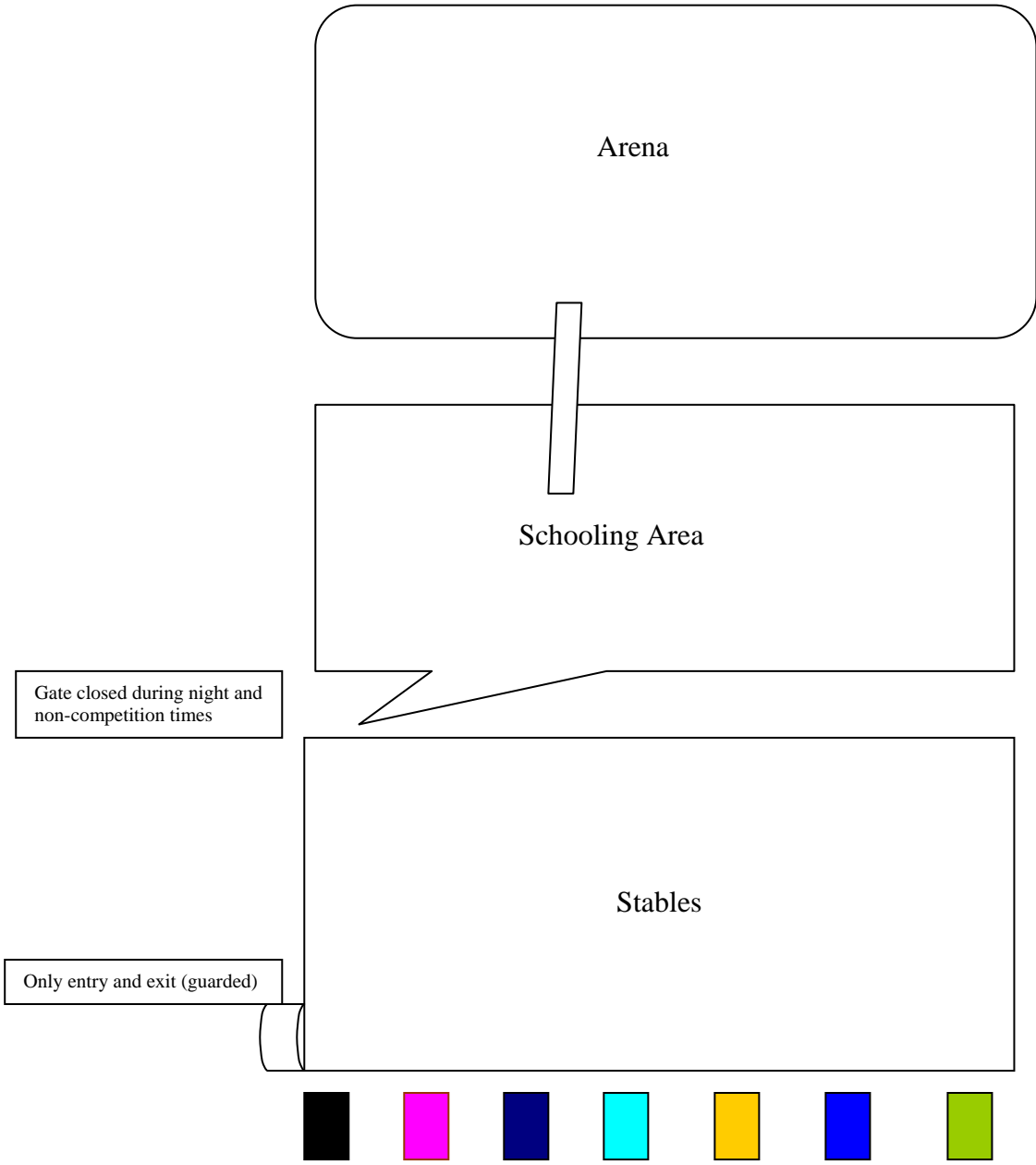
7) GRAZING AREA

It is recommended that a grazing area be provided at all outdoor events and that this be subject to random control if available horse must only be grazed or walked in hand within this area.

The foreign judge/ TD at events will be specifically asked to check that the relevant requirements are met as reasonable as can be expected depending on the discipline and to clearly indicate any shortfalls following which consideration may be given to the altering the category of the event in future.

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT
FOR
THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Federation Equestrian International (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be

paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1 At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2 Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3 Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4 Every effort must be made to ensure that horse receives proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This cover proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5 The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

- FEI World Cup™ Competition - Arab League

- The **FEI World Cup™** competition is open to the top 25 placed riders in the Qualifying competition, provided they were not eliminated or retired.
- Only one horse per rider is allowed in this competition.
- If the home country does not have a rider among the top 25 qualified riders, the highest placed home-rider in the qualifying competition may compete in the **FEI World Cup™** competition as an extra rider bringing the starting field to 26. If there is a home rider among the top 25, the number of riders in competition is limited to 25.
- If non Arab League Riders have participated in the Qualifying competition the number of riders eligible for participation in the **FEI World Cup™** competition will be increased until the 25th Arab League Rider is qualified at all times.
- If one or more qualified rider(s) decide(s) not to participate, the next best placed competitor according to the result of the Qualifying competition may take his place, providing that the competitor concerned has not been eliminated or has retired in the qualifying competition. Such replacements are allowed until two hours before the start of the **FEI World Cup™** competition.
- If the best placed competitor, according to the results of the qualifying competition, is a non Arab League Rider, both this competitor and the next best placed Arab League Rider will be eligible for participation in the **FEI World Cup™** competition.
- Riders qualified for this competition can participate with the horse of their choice.
- The World Cup competition is run according to the following formula:
 - Over a two round competition with the first round not against the clock and the second round against the clock, Art. 273.3.3. The top 25% of competitors on points from the first round, in any case all clear rounds
 - Qualify for the second round based on their penalties in the first round. Those not qualified for the second round are placed according to their penalties in the first round.
 - Classification will be according to Art.273.4.3.
- If the **FEI World Cup™** competition takes place on the 2nd day of a 3 day event, the riders will be allowed to enter the Grand Prix or a smaller competition on day 3 with the World Cup horse.
- If the **FEI World Cup™** competition is the Grand Prix on day 3, day 1 should include a competition with obstacles of approximately 1.35 m in height.
- Each **FEI World Cup™** competition is run at a minimum speed of 350m/min. The height of the obstacles can be anything between 1.40m and 1.60m. The spread must be proportional to the height and not more than 2m. If there is a water jump, it cannot be wider than 4m outdoor.
 - The starting order in the first round of the **FEI World Cup™** competition is according to a draw.

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

Please Note:-

- ▶ *Junior Riders can participate only in Junior Competitions.*
- ▶ *Senior Riders can compete only in CSI classes if they will not be qualified for FEI World Cup™ Class.*
- ▶ *Senior FEI World Cup™ Class Riders can compete in CSI class with another horse.*
- ▶ *We will select only 25 qualified riders for the Class no. 7 and rest of riders (who are not qualified) can compete in Class no. 10.*
- ▶ **Two horses maximum per Senior rider for the show.**
- ▶ **Two horse maximum per Junior rider for the show. (one horse in the Grand Prix)**
- ▶ *C-class rider is not allowed to jump in the show.*
- ▶ ***The entry will be closed on 4th January 2010.***

- ▶ *The horses can not come before Tuesday (12th January 2010) and should leave on Monday (18th January 2010).*
- ▶ *Veterinary examination, Horse inspections & Passport controls on 13th January 2010. Location is Old parade ring in front of the Old Racing Grandstand at Abu Dhabi Equestrian Club. Timing for Foreign Horses – 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Timing for Local Horses – 02:00 p.m. to 04:00 p.m.*
